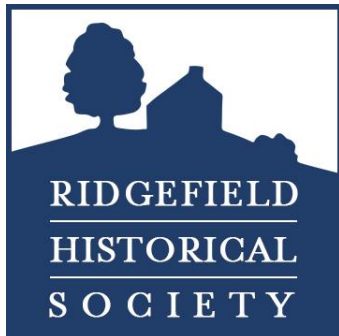

FIRST OF 10,000,000 COPIES OF THE NEW SUFFRAGE POSTER.

FIVE thousand artists competed in the production of this poster picture. This is the first time you have seen it, and soon you are going to see it again, not once but hundreds, perhaps thousands, of times on billboards, in store windows and in public conveyances from one end of the United States to the other.

Ten million copies of this poster are to be printed and displayed to emphasize the opening of the 1917 campaign of the National American Woman Suffrage Association.

"We want something that will tell a story in a few broad lines," said the circular sent out by the National American Woman Suffrage Association, inviting applications for this 1917 campaign picture. It was sent to more than 2,000 noted artists, and five money prizes were offered as inducements to compete. Five hundred promptly responded, and in Mrs. Edwin Thompson Sisson, Edwin H. Danforth, Robert Anson and Arthur B. Sullivan were the luck of choosing the winners. They chose Edward A. Poucher as first, awarding him a prize of \$250. Mr. Poucher is a New Yorker, well-known in artistic circles for his striking poster effects. This is an excellent example of his art.

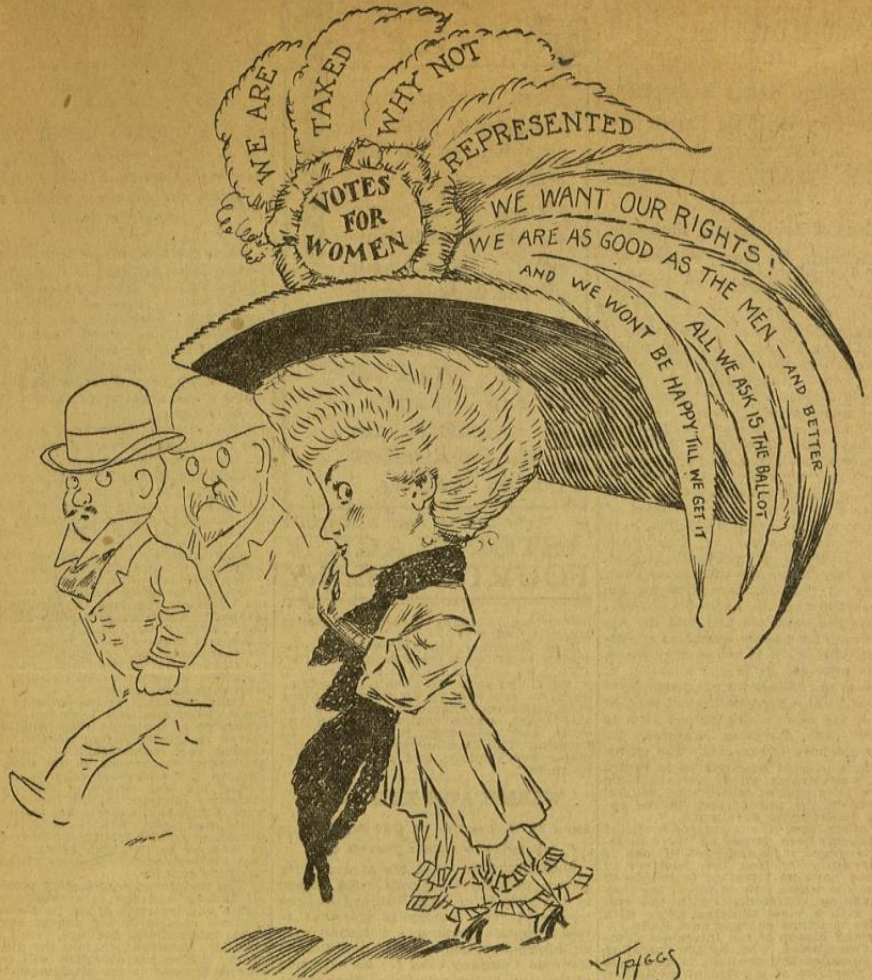

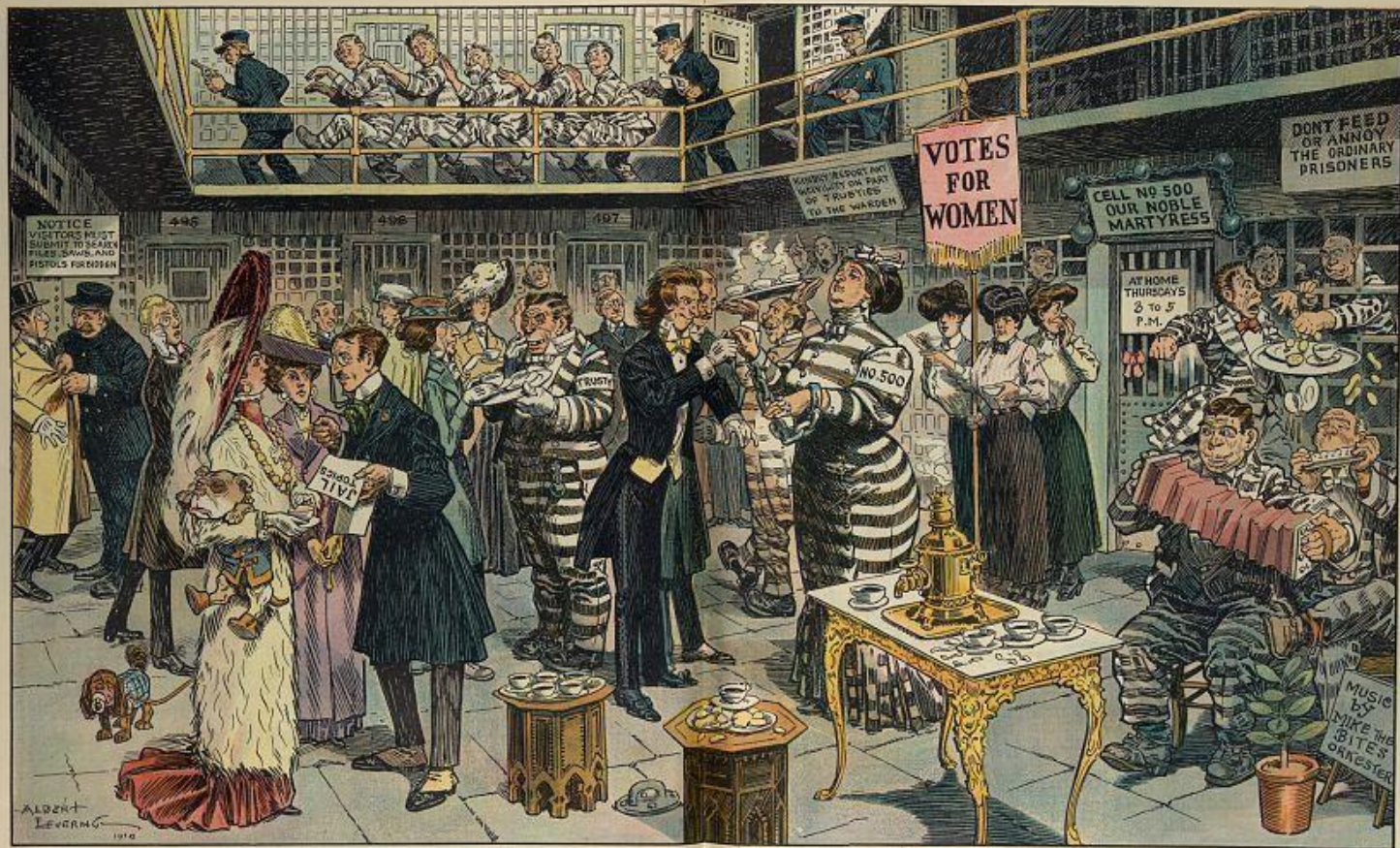

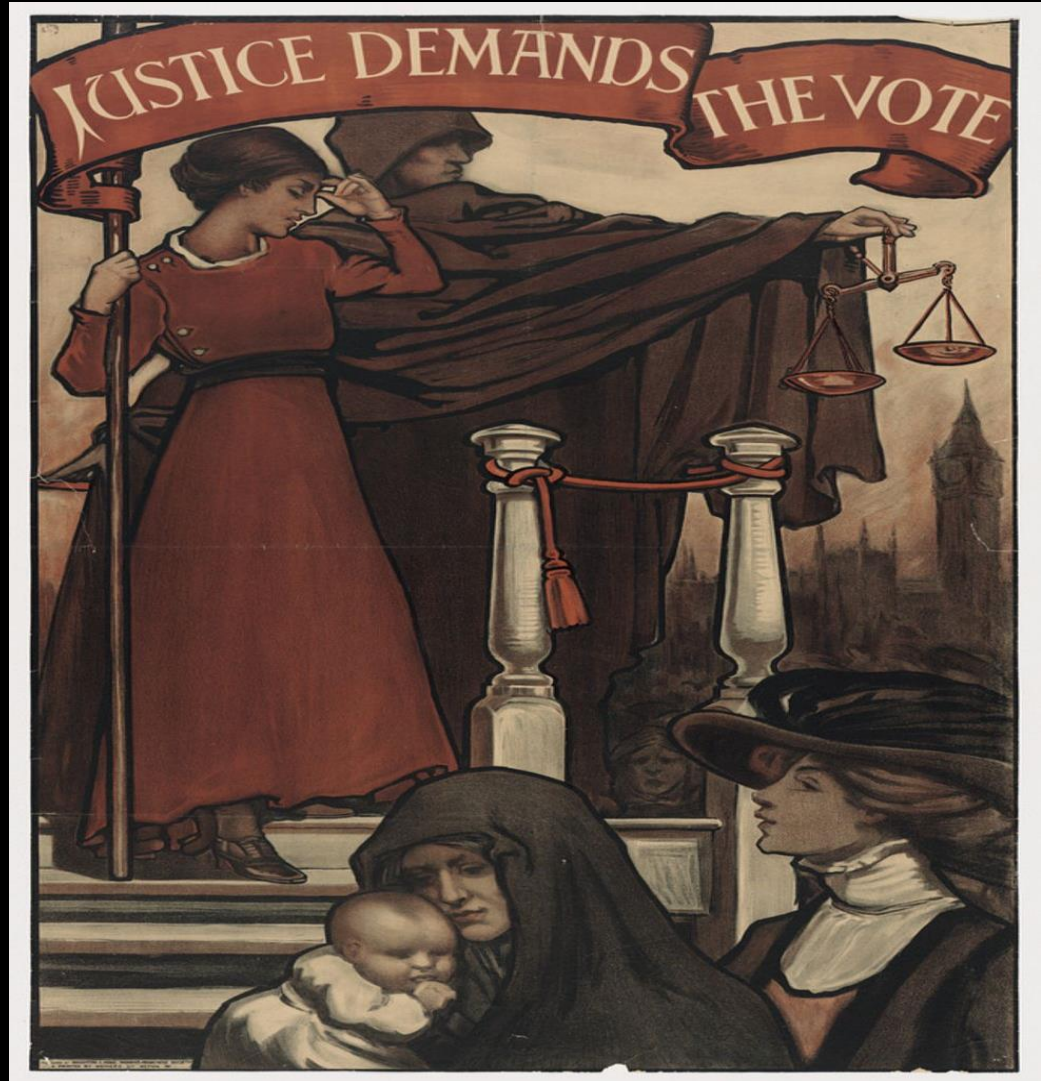

# DECLARATION OF SENTIMENTS

## WE HOLD THESE TRUTHS TO BE SELF-EVIDENT:

that all men and women are created equal;  
that they are endowed by their Creator  
with certain inalienable rights;  
that among these are life, liberty,  
and the pursuit of happiness;  
that to secure these rights governments are instituted,  
deriving their powers from the consent of the governed.

THE HISTORY OF MANKIND IS A  
HISTORY OF REPEATED INJURIES  
and usurpation on the part of man toward woman,  
having in direct object the establishment  
of an absolute tyranny over her.

...WOMEN DO FEEL THEMSELVES  
AGGRIEVED, OPPRESSED,  
and fraudulently deprived of their most sacred rights,  
we insist that they have immediate admission  
to all the rights and privileges which belong to them  
as citizens of these United States.


IN ENTERING UPON  
THE GREAT WORK BEFORE US,  
we anticipate no small amount of misconception,  
misrepresentation, and ridicule;  
but we shall use every instrumentality within our power  
to effect our object. We shall employ agents,  
circulate tracts, petition the State and national Legislatures,  
and endeavor to enlist the pulpit  
and the press in our behalf.

We hope this Convention will be followed  
by a series of Conventions,  
embracing every part of the country.
